#### TIPS ON SAVING (FOR PARENTS)

Knowledge is power, and that's why learning basic information about money is key. Here are useful tips for encouraging your children to save.

**SET GOALS:** Never think your child is too young to understand the basics of goal setting. Identify a need from their list of wants and help turn it into a goal. For erxample, if a child wants a bicycle, passing the school exams can be a good challenge to help him earn the gift of a bicycle. Therefore passing the school exam becomes a goal

GIVE POCKET MONEY: It's not folklore, money does not grow on trees! Basic money management can be taught by giving weekly pocket money and monitoring their spending with a budget. You can actually help your child save for the bicycle with some savings from the weekly pocket money. This also helps children to realise the importance of earning, versus just being given.

OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT: Don't just open a bank account for your children, make them an active part of operating the account. No matter how small the cash amount they get/earn, deposit it in their Bank account on their behalf and show them the deposit slip as evidence of payment.

#### CREATIVE KIDS: CRAFT DIY-YOU CAN MAKE IT TOO!

The Paper Roll Bunny Challenge.

#### Materials needed:

- A pair of scissors
- Poster color/crayon
- Cotton bud
- Marker

access>>>

White cardboard paper

#### Steps involved:

- #1 With a poster color or a crayon, color the empty toilet paper roll.
- #2 Use a pair of scissors, cut two circles from the top part of the colored empty paper roll and flatten to get an oval shape. This will serve as the ears.
- #3 Attach these oval shapes to the top of the colored empty paper roll with the help of a glue.
- #4 Cut out two small circles from a white cardboard paper for the eyes and attach to the paper roll with glue.
- #5 Use the crayon/marker pen to draw the bunny nose, mouth, whiskers and also color the eyes of the bunny.
- #6 Attach the cotton bud to the back of the paper roll to serve as the bunny tail ...voilà!
